Using the Pattern

Copy your pattern onto paper piecing paper or vellum.

Cut apart at the thick lines on the pattern. You should have 5 pieces. I tried to cut down the middle of the thick line. After doing this, you will not have a margin completely around all of your pieces.

After placing your fabric, be sure to cut a ¼" seam allowance around the entire piece.

The Center A is a stand-alone piece. I sewed the pattern across the top margin to stabilize it to the fabric.

Press with a dry iron, no steam.

To assemble, I turned it fabric side down for ease. Start with the shortest bottom one to Center A, either left or right depending on the pattern. Then add the other bottom piece. Add top corners last.

No cutting directions.


Paper Piecing directions are attached for those not familiar with the process.

Be generous in your cuts as there are lots of angles.

Use any beads, buttons or gee-gaws that please you. To lace or not to lace?

I put a $2'' - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ border around my blocks to stabilize them for photos. Play with this one! Quick to make.
